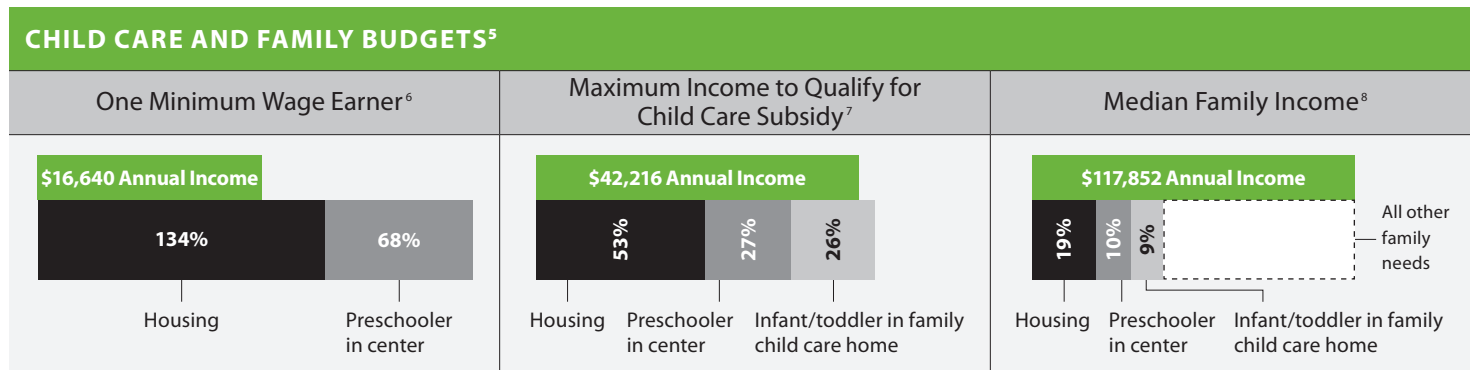
Data that describes child care – statewide and in California counties
